CHAINS

- 28.75 Over swampy land bears N & S
- 40.00 Set an ironstone 24x8x10 ins., 18 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N face from which
 - A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.24 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 36 lks. dist.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B T
 - A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.21*W., 73 lks. dist.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B T
- 40.25 Leave swamp, bears N & S and ascend gradually
- 65.25 Top of ridge, 150 ft. above swamp bears N.20*E., and S.20* West., descend over ridges & ravines
- 80.00 The SW corner of T. 31 S., R. 1 W., described heretofore

- 39.53 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on South Boundary sec. 36 which is an ironstone 6x8x10 ins. above ground firmly set and marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general
