

Retracement of the West Boundary of T. 31 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

I reestablish the cor. in its original position for sec. 13, T. 31 S., R. 3 W., only as follows

No stones obtainable

Set a Fir Post 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on West Boundary sec. 13 marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W face from which

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.68*W., 70 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 13 B T

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.82*W., 52 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 13 B T

The course of this line is S.0*23'E., and the distance is 40.98 chs.

Commencing at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. I run

South on East Boundary sec. 13, T. 31 S., R. 3 W.

9.85 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course S.75*E.

21.75 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N.70*E.

37.19 The closing cor. of secs. 18 & 19 bears East 30 lks. dist.

40.47 The cor. of secs. 13 & 24, T. 31 S., R. 3 W., bears E. 30 lks. dist.

The course of this line is S.0*26'E., and the distance is 40.47 chs.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock

Undergrowth, Madrone, Hemlock, Hazel

Mountainous or heavily timbered land

Land covered with dense undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey. 81.45 chs.

South on East Boundary sec. 24 T. 31 S., R. 3 W.

Over Mountainous land, heavily timbered and covered with dense undergrowth

Along East slope
