	Descend.	-250
3.75	A stream, 10 lks. wide, course NW; ascend.	+200
	Leave heavy timber in dense vine maple, elk brush, rhododendron, willow, blackberry, hazel and balm.	
38.00	A fir, 30 ins. diam., on line marked with 2 notches on N and S sides.	
40.00	Summit of mountain ridge, course E and W. Set a cedar post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ S on W face; from which A laurel, 17 ins. diam., bears S.75½*W., 29 lks. dist., marked ¼ S B T. A laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears N.42½*E., 44½ lks. dist., marked ¼ S B T.
