

Subdivisions of T. 31 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

I commence at the cor. to secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S boundary of the tp. which is a post, 4 ins. sq., firmly set, marked T 31 S S 36 on NE., R 4 W S 1 on SE., T 32 S S 2 on SW., and S 35 on NW., faces, with 1 notch on E and 5 notches on W edges; from which

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.38*E., 48 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 4 W S 36 B T.

A laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.20*E., 13 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 4 W S 1 B T.

A fir, 5 ins. diam., (7 ins. now) bears S.22*W., 20 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 4 W S 2 B T.

A laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.20*W., 30 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 4 W S 35 B T.

Thence I run N.0*1'W., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Va.19 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E.

Ascend in timber and brush.

12.75 A ravine, course SW; water in holes.

25.00 Leave heavy timber, in dense brush.

40.00 Set a stone, 14x10x4 ins. 10 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W face; from which

A B.oak, 6 ins. diam., bears S.80-3/4*W., 45 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A B.oak, 10 ins. diam., bears N.40 $\frac{1}{4}$ *E., 20 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

51.25 A spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE.

55.75 A fir, 4 ft. diam., on line marked with 2 notches on N and S sides.
