	Ascend in fir and laurel timber and brush.	+75
5.00	Summit of spur, course N and S; descend.	-250
24.25	A stream, 1 lk. wide, course SW.	
24.65	A stream, 1 lk. wide, course SW; ascend.	+125
27.00	A spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course S.	
33.00	Descend.	-50
35.35	A spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course S; ascend.	+90
39.65	To a point, 7 lks. N of the ¼ sec. cor. which is a post, 4 ins. sq., greatly decayed, marked ¼ S on N face, I find the 2 witness trees. I remove this post and set a fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ S on N face; from which A fir, 8 ins. diam., (10 ins. now) bears N.62°E., 15 lks. dist., marked ¼ S B T. A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.25°W., 6 lks. dist., marked ¼ S B T.	
45.00	Descend.	-500
59.60	A stream, 5 lks. wide, course SW; ascend.	+175
74.25	Summit of ridge, course NE and SW; descend.	-40
79.40	To a point, 5 lks. N of the cor. to secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28, which is a post, greatly decayed with marks nearly obliterated, I find the 4 witness trees. I remove this post and set a stone, 16x10x10 ins. 12 ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28, marked with 3 notches on E and 2 notches on S edges; from which A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.80°E., 39 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 4 W 22 B T. A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.12°E., 38 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 4 W S 27 B T.
