

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Subdivision of T. 31 S., R. 4 W.

CHAINS

- 40.00 Set a stone, 18x6x6 ins. 12 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on N face; from which  
 A laurel, 16 ins. diam., bears S.39 $\frac{1}{4}$ \*E., 41 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.  
 A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.53\*E., 24 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- 69.50 A stream, 4 lks. wide, course N.80\*W., ascend. +175
- 79.00 Intersect the W bdy. of the tp. and set temp. post.  
 The post cor. set for secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30 is gone.  
 I find 2 of the original witness trees.  
 At cor. point.  
 Set a stone, 14x10x4 ins. 10 ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 24 and 25, marked with 4 notches on N and 2 notches on S edges; from which  
 A fir, 7 ins. diam., (10 ins. now) bears S.10\*E., 62 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 4 W S 30 B T.  
 A fir, 4 ins. diam., (12 ins. now) bears S.68\*W., 41 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 5 W S 25 B T.  
 The 2 laurel witness trees are destroyed by fire.  
 I mark 1 tree as follows  
 A fir, 8 ins. diam., which bears N.60\*W., 11 lks. dist., T 31 S R 5 W S 24 B T.  
 As this is a cor. to secs. 24 and 25 only, I destroy the marks on the fir witness tree which refers to sec. 30.  
 I measure N 5.92 chs. to temp. post. As this closing is not within the prescribed limits, I begin at the cor. to secs. 24 and 25.  
 Thence I run  
 South, on a blank line, bet. secs. 25 and 30.  
 Va.18-3/4\*E.
- Descend. -300
- 9.30 A stream, 1 lk. wide, course E; ascend. +75
- 15.50 Descend. -40
