The old cor. established for secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, is not a cor. to secs. 5 and 6. I, therefore, destroy this post and also the marks on the old bearing trees S of the cor. in T 31 S R 4 W.

Soil, S 9.48 chs. rocky, 4th rate; balance 3d rate.

Heavily timbered with fir, laurel, cedar, chinquapin, yew, alder and maple. 95.50 chs.

Dense undergrowth of laurel, vine maple, hazel, arrow-wood, rhododendron, chinquapin, alder, huckleberry, madrone and live oak. 105.00 chs.

51 miles, 8 chs. and 38 lks. of the subdivision lines run over mountainous land, through heavy timber or dense undergrowth.

47 chs. and 36 lks. of the connecting lines run over mountainous land, through heavy timber or dense undergrowth.

13 miles, 21 chs. and 63 lks. retraced over mountainous land, through heavy timber or dense undergrowth.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township is mountainous and is covered with heavy timber and dense brush. There is some good land along Cow Creek in the S part of the tp. which will produce good crops of grain without irrigation. The tp. is well watered by Cow Creek and mountain streams of pure, clear water.
