CHAINS

- 80.25 Intersect East boundary of township, 80 lks. South of corner to sections 13, 18, 19, & 24, which is a stake firmly set in the ground, from which
- A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.21*E., 23 lks. dis.
Marked T 31 S R 4 W S 18 B T.
- A Fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S.26*E., 8 lks. dist.
Marked T 31 S R 4 W S 19 B T.
- A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.58*W., 20 lks. dis.
Marked T 31 S R 5 W S 24 B T.
- A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.81*W., 58 lks. dis.
Marked T 31 S R 5 W S 13 B T.
- Thence, I run
S.89*26*W., on a true line between sections 13 and 24,
with same var.
- 40.13 Set a Laurel post, 3 feet long, 3 ins. square, 18 ins. in ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on the North side for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., from which
- A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.78*W., 138 lks.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.45*W., 160 lks.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 80.25 The corner to sections 13, 14, 23 & 24.
Land, mountainous and broken.
Soil, rocky and gravelly, third rate.
Timber, dense growth of Fir and Cedar.
Undergrowth, Fir, Cedar, & Laurel

- North between sections 13 and 14.
Along steep E. slope of mountain.
