Land, mountainous and broken.

Soil, rocky and clay, third and fourth rates.

Timber, dense growth and forest of fir, cedar, and laurel.

Undergrowth, same kinds of wood with hazel and arrow-wood.

North, between secs. 28 and 29.

Descend.

- 9.40 A creek, 3 lks. wide, C NE.
- 13.90 A creek, 2 lks. wide, C E.
- 37.75 A creek, 8 lks. wide, C E. Ascend.
- 40.00 Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. square, 18 ins. in ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on the W. face, from which
- A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears East, 40 lks. dist.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.75*W., 9 lks. dist.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. Descend.
- 53.00 A creek, 1 lk. wide, C E. Ascend.
- 73.00 Top of spur, C NE.
- 80.00 Set a maple post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 20 ins. in ground for the cor. to secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29, marked T 31 S R 5 W S 21 on the NE. face.
- S 28 on the SE. face
S 29 on the SW. face and
S 20 on the NW. face. Also two notches on the South and four notches on the East, angles of the same, from which
- A laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.25*E., 39 lks.
Marked T 31 S R 5 W S 21 B T.
- A laurel, 14 ins. diam., bears S.60*E., 28 lks.
Marked T 31 S R 5 W S 28 B T.
