North, on line between Sections 20 & 21.

Steep descent.

13.60 A Creek, 18 lks. wide, c S.60*E. Ascend.

40.00 Set a basalt stone, 20x12x6 ins., 12 ins. in ground for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the W. face, from which
A Live Oak, 15 ins. diam., bears S.38*W., 44 lks.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.15*E., 29 lks. dis.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

72.50 Top of high ridge, c E. & W.

80.00 Set a fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 20 ins. in ground for the cor. to secs. 16, 17, 20 & 21, marked T 31 S R 5 W S 16 on the NE. face, S 21 on the SE. face, S 20 on the SW. face, and S 17 on NW. face.
Also, ~~three~~ notches on the South and four notches on the East angles of the same, from which

A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.64*E., 43 lks.
Marked T 31 S R 5 W S ~~16~~ B T.

A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.56*E., 30 lks.
Marked T 31 S R 5 W S 21 B T.

A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.20*W., 14 lks.
Marked T 31 S R 5 W S 20 B T.

A Fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N.62*W., 24 lks. dis.
Marked T 31 S R 5 W S 17 B T.

Land, mountainous and broken.

Soil, clay and rocks, third rate.

Densely covered with forests of Fir, Cedar, Laurel, and Pine.

Thick undergrowth of Fir, Cedar, Hazel, and Arrow-wood.
