Land, broken and mountainous.

Soil, rocky, third and fourth rates.

Covered with dense forests of fir, cedar, laurel, and pine.

Thick undergrowth of cedar, fir, and pine, with live-oak,
hazel and maple.

From the cor. to sec. 5, 6, 31 and 32 on the South boundary of the township, which is a post, 4 ins. square, firmly set in ground, marked T 31 S R 5 W S 32 on the NE. face, T 32 S S 5 on the SE. face, S 6 on the SW. face, S 31 on the NW. face, also five notches on the E. and one notch on the W. angle of the same, from which

A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears N.50*E., 6 lks. dist.

Tree has the scars of witness marks. Did not open same.

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S.22*E., 7 lks. dist.

Marked T 32 S R 5 W S 5 B T.

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S.22*W., 23 lks. dist.

Marks on tree. Did not open same.

A laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears N.83*W., 32 lks. dist.

Marked T 31 S R 5 W S 31 B T.
