Ascend along SE. slope.

62.00 Top of ridge, course NE. and SW.

Begin steep descent.

80.00 Set Fir pest, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the
ground for cor. to secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24 mkd.
