- 80.40 The cor. to secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14.  
 Land, mountainous.  
 Soil, 4th rate.  
 Timber, Fir, Pine, Laurel and Live Oak, with  
 Thick undergrowth of Fir, Laurel, Live Oak, and Balm.  
 July 3rd 1882.
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- Va.19\*15'E.
- North, bet. secs. 11 and 12.  
 Descend along steep side hill facing SE.
- 13.00 Enter Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N.
- 14.30 Leave same, course NW.  
 Ascend S<sup>w</sup>. slope.
- 40.00 Set a Cedar post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 18 ins. in the  
 ground for  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S on W. face, from which  
 A Laurel, 14 ins. dia., bears N.75\*W., 13 lks. dis.  
 mkd.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S B T. and  
 A Fir, 14 ins. dia., bears S.55\*E. 17 lks. dis.  
 mkd.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S B T.
- 50.00 Very steep descent.
- 59.90 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course W. Ascend.
- 77.50 Top of spur, course W. Descend.
- 80.00 Set a Maple post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 20 ins. in the  
 ground for the cor. to secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12  
 mkd. T 31 S R 6 W S 1 on NE.  
 S 12 on SE.  
 S 11 on SW. and  
 S 2 on NW. faces, with 1 notch on E. and 5 notches  
 on S. edges, from which  
 A Laurel, 6 ins. dia., bears N.65\*E., 59 lks. dis.  
 mkd. T 31 S R 6 W S 1 B T.  
 A Fir, 24 ins. dia., bears S.24\*E., 44 lks. dis.  
 mkd. T 31 S R 6 W S 12 B T.
