40.00	Set Laurel post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 18 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. mkd. $\frac{1}{2}$ S on W. face, from which A Laurel, 7 ins. dia., bears S.50*E., 47 lks. dis. mkd. $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T. A Fir, 42 ins. dia., bears N.86*W., 34 lks. dis. mkd. $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
51.25	Top of ridge, course NE. and SW. Descend.
75.00	Along side hill facing W.
80.00	Set Chinkapin post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. to secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27., mkd. T 31 S R 6 W S 23 on NE, S 26 on SE, S 27 on SW, and S 22 on NW. faces, with 2 notches on E and S. edges, from which A Laurel, 8 ins. dia., bears N.52*E., 25 lks. dis. mkd. T 31 S R 6 W S 23 B T. A Laurel, 10 ins. dia., bears S.20*E., 31 lks. dis. mkd. T 31 S R 6 W S 26 B T. A Laurel, 8 ins. dia., bears S.80*W., 22 lks. dis. mkd. T 31 S R 6 W S 27 B T. A Laurel, 8 ins. dia., bears N.60*W., 55 lks. dis. mkd. T 31 S R 6 W S 22 B T.
