GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The general features of this Township, are mountainous, broken, with small narrow vallies along the creeks. The soil is varied from 1st class to rocky barren mountain peaks. The lands are generally covered with dense forests of Fir, Pine, Cedar, Laurel, Yew, Oak, and a few other varieties. Much of the timber is very large and valueable.

Iron ore is found in large quantities in several localities, while other mineral deposits are supposed to exist in various localities in the Township.

The Township is well watered by fine springs, and mountain branches. Middle Creek, will afford ample power for all classes of manufacturing interests. There is one settlement in Sec. 2, two in Sec. 4, one in Sec. 21, two in Sec. 28, one in Sec. 29, and two in Sec. 30.

Mr. Ketching has considerable improvements on his place in Sec. 28, as has Mr. Russell in Sec. 2, and Mr. Lyon's in Sec. 4, Others merely cabins and location.
