Land, mountainous and broken. Soil, rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.

Timber, Fir, Pine, Laurel and Cedar.

Thick undergrowth of Fir, Laurel, Live-Oak, Cedar and Pine.

Preliminary to commencing the Survey of this Tp, I on the night of July 21st, 1882, took an observation on the star Palaris and established a true meridian line and on the following morning, testing my instrument,- which is a Burl's improved Solar compass, thereon I found it correct.

Survey commenced July 22nd, 1882, Beginning at the cor. to Secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S. bdy. of the Tp. which is a post, 4 ins. sq., set firmly in the ground and marked, T 31 S R 7 W S 36 on NE; T 32 S S 1 on SE; S 2 on SW and S 35 on NW faces, with 1 notch on E. and 5 notches on W. edges, from which

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.80°E., 48 lks. dist.

Marked T 31 S R 7 W S 36 B T.

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.20°E., 12 lks. dist.

Marked T 32 S R 7 W S 1 B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.60°W., 16 lks. dist.

Marked T 32 S R 7 W S 2 B T.
