SOUTH BOUNDARY OF T. 31 S., R. 9 W.,
AS SURVEYED BY W. H. BYARS, DEPUTY SURVEYOR,
UNDER CONTRACT No. 727, DATED DECEMBER 20, 1900.

CHAINS

I. begin at the Township corner of Township 31 S. Ranges 8 and 9 W., which is a post firmly set in the ground and marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

Thence I run

West, on South boundary of Sec. 36.

Steep descent, SW slope of mountain.

9.90 West Fork, (Cow Creek) 100 lks. wide, course SE. -300

12.00 Steep ascent. Rocky bluffs NW and SE.

18.00 Top of rocky bluff, NW and SE. +600

34.00 Creek 3 lks. wide, course N. -100

40.00 Marked a Fir, 10 ins. diam., on rocky point S. 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ S +100
on N. face for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor.

No other trees within limits for witness trees. Pits impracticable.

42.50 A creek 10 lks. wide, course NE. -500

Ascend steep rocky bluffs, course NE and S.

60.00 Top of spur. Course N. dense undergrowth. +600

64.40 Unable to find old corner.

75.00 Steep descent; rocky bluffs, course NE and SW.

80.00 Marked a Fir, 50 ins. diam., T 31 S S 36 on NE, R 9 W -500
S 35 on NW and one notch on E. and five notches on West sides, for the cor. of Secs. 35 and 36.

No trees within limits for witness trees.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, stone and clay, 3rd and 4th rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Pine and Laurel.

Dense undergrowth of Fir, Cedar, Pine, Laurel, Huckleberry and Vines.

Mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth. 80.00 chains.
