CHAINS

Mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth. 80.00 chains.

April 25, 1901.

North, between Secs. 7 and 12.

Steep ascent.

17.00 Summit of Ketchen Mountain, course N.30*E. +400

Trail from Eden to Camas Valley, course NE and SW, along S. slope of mountain.

40.00 Set a Basalt stone, 16x12x5 ins. 12 ins. in ground marked 1/4 on W. side for 1/4 Cor. from which

A Hemlock, 18 ins. diam., bears N.58*E., 30 lks. dist., marked S 7 1/4 S B T.

A Hemlock, 30 ins. diam., bears N.85*W., 66 lks. dist., marked S 12 1/4 S B T.

50.50 A creek 1 lk. wide, course NW. -300

53.40 Top of spur, course NW. +100

56.00 Course NW. A draw. - 50

70.00 A spur, course W. +300

80.00 Set a Basalt stone, 12x10x8 ins. 8 ins. in the ground marked with 5 notches on the S and 1 notch on the N. angles for the corner to Secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, from which -100

A Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N.20*E., 175 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 9 W S 6 B T.

A Hemlock, 5 ins. diam., bears S.85*E., 11 lks. dist., marked T 31 S. R 9 W S 7 B T.

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.55*W., 15 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 10 W S 12 B T.

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.75*W., 80 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 10 W S 1 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock and Cedar.
