A Cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears S.50*W., 23 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 9 W S 14 B T.

A Cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N.12*W., 32 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 9 W S 11 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay and rocky, 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock and Laurel.

Undergrowth, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Laurel, Manzanita, Balm, Arrowwood and Hazel.

Mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth. 80.00 chains.

May 1st, 1901.

East on a random line bet. Secs. 12 and 13.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. corner.

80.30 Intersect E. bdy. of Tp. 15 lks. S. of cor. of Secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18.

Thence I run

S.89*54'W., on true line bet. Secs. 12 and 13.

0.15 Creek 1 lk. wide, course SW.

34.10 Trail, course N. and S.

40.15 Set a Yew post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in ground, marked S 12 $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N and S 13 on S faces for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. corner from which

A Fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N.75*E., 16 lks. dist., marked S 12 $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A White Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.45*W., 10 lks. dist., marked S 13 $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

40.46 Creek 16 lks. wide, course W.

41.50 Leave creek 16 lks. wide, course S.

42.00 Improved lands and fencing S. of line.

46.00 Steep ascent.

70.00 Top of spur, course N.80*E.

Enter old burn Course N.80*E and S.80*W.
