

SUBDIVISIONS OF T. 31 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

Undergrowth, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Chinquapin, Laurel, Hazel, Live Oak, Vinemaple, Rhododendron & Manzanita. Mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense Undergrowth. 70.23 chains.

May 3rd, 1901.

At the cor. of Secs. 34 and 35 on the S. boundary of the township.

Thence I run

N.0°02'W bet. Secs. 34 and 35.

Descend in old burn. Dense undergrowth.

20.00 Leave burn; enter green timber, course E and W.

40.00 Set a Fir post, 24 ins. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked S 35 on E. S 34  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on W for  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor. from which,

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.70°E., 24 lks. dist., marked S 35  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

A Chinquapin, 5 ins. diam., bears N.70°W., 15 lks. marked S 34  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

50.00 Top of spur, course N.20°E.

Descend NW slope.

80.00 Set a fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. to Secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, marked T 31 S S 26 on NE, R 9 W S 35 on SE, S 34 on SW and S 27 on NW faces, with 1 notch on S and 2 notches on E edges, from which,

A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.50°E., 71 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 9 W S 26 B T.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.2°E., 37 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 9 W S 35 B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.65°W., 48 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 9 W S 34 B T.

A Chinquapin, 8 ins. diam., bears N.2°W., 66 lks. dist., marked T 31 S R 9 W S 27 B T.

Lands, rolling NE and SW.

Timber, chiefly Fir, Cedar, Hemlock and Pine.
