22.00	Top of ridge, course N and S. Descend.	
31.00	Draw, course SW.	-200
40.05	Set a Cedar post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, marked S 14 $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N and S 23 on S faces for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. from which A Cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S.22*W, 28 lks. dist., marked S 23 $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N.5*W., 8 lks. dist., marked S 14 $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. Continue descent, E. slope of mountain.

80.10	The corner of Secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky, 3rd and 4th rate. Timber, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Live Oak and Laurel.
