CHAINS

Chinquapin, Laurel, Pine, Yew, Ash and Oak. This timber is its chief value.

Prospecting for gold has been and is being carried on at many places in the township - Placer Mines in the SW portion and Quartz location in many other localities..

The township is well watered. Fish and wild game is in abundance.

There appears to be only one permanent homesteader in the township which is Adolf Emiel Costian Schwagermann, located in Sec. 13. W. H. Bom has a location in Sec. 2, Friend and Martindale in Sec. 30.

The lands, not belonging to the R. R. Co. are reported as being covered with indemnity script and hundreds of mineral locations are said to be made in many localities, the chief of which is Friend's and Martindale's in Sec. 31.
