39.92	<p>Post gone, witness trees standing and agree with notes furnished by the Surveyor General.</p> <p>Set a Fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, at the point established from the witness trees for the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. post marked Sec. 30 on E and S $25 \frac{1}{4}$ S on W faces.</p> <p>Descend NW slope of mountain.</p>
