

RESURVEY OF EAST BOUNDARY OF T. 31 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

Set a Fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked T 31 S S 18 on NE, R 8 W S 19 on SE, R 9 W S 24 on SW and S 13 on NW faces, with 3 notches on the N and S angles.

The witnesses are those furnished in the notes.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky and clay, 4th rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Yew, Laurel, Chinquapin and Pine.

Undergrowth, same, with Balm, Rhododendron, Huckleberry and Vinemaple.

Mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth. 79.86 chains.

North, on E. boundary of Sec. 13.

Descend NW slope of mountain.

15.50 Steep descent.

32.36 Creek 5 lks. wide, course SW.

Steep ascent.

39.50 Trail to Nichols Station, course E and NW.

40.20 Point for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. corner. Corner post gone.

Set a Fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on E and S 13 $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W faces.

Established from old witness corners.

Along W. slope of mountain.

50.00 Brush fence, course N.1*E.

79.92 The point for cor. of Secs. 7, 12, 13 and 19.

Corner gone, witness trees standing.

Set a Fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, marked T 31 S S 7 on NE, R 8 W S 18 on SE, R 9 W S 13 on SW and S 12 on NW faces, with 4 notches on S and 2 notches on N angles.

Land, S, part mountainous, N, part rolling.

Soil, gravel and clay, 4th and 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Pine, Laurel, Chinquapin
