CHAINS

. and Yew.

Undergrowth, same, with Vinemaple, Rhododendron, Balm,  
Huckleberry and Salal.

Mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense  
undergrowth. 79.92 chains.

At the corner of Secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18.

Thence I run

North, on E. boundary of Sec. 12.

0.25 Creek 1 lk. wide, course SW.

Over spur.

10.50 Creek 3 lks. wide, course W.

39.97 Point for  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. corner. Post gone.

Witness trees standing and agree with notes furnished  
by the Surveyor General.

Set a Fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the  
ground, marked S.7 on E and S 12  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on W faces, for  
the  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. corner. Point established from the witness  
trees which agree with notes furnished by the  
Surveyor General.

76.95 Creek 2 lks. wide, course W.

80.06 The corner of Secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12.

Post and witness trees standing and agree with notes  
furnished by the Surveyor General.

Land, W slope of mountain rolling.

Soil, clay and gravel, 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Laurel, Chinquapin and Yew.

Undergrowth, same, with Rhododendron, Balm, Huckleberry  
and Salal.

Mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense  
undergrowth.. 80.06 chains.
