

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

West Bdy. of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

## CHAINS

- 62.10 Creek, 5 lks. wide, in ravine, 50 ft. deep, course S.60\*W.
- 68.00 Enter dense laurel thicket, bears E. and W.
- 77.50 Summit of divide between Beaver and Cow Creeks, 300 ft. above Cow Creek, descends toward the SW. Descend steep N. slope into Beaver Creek.
- 80.00 Set an ironstone, 15x15x5 ins., 10 ins. in ground, for cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7, and 12, marked with 1 notch on the North and 5 notches on the South edges, from which
- A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.63\*E., 29 lks. dist.  
Marked T 32 S R 2 W S 6 B T.
- A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.85\*E., 43 lks. dist.  
Marked T 32 S R 2 W S 7 B T.
- A matherone, 12 ins. diam., bears S.50\*W., 25 lks.  
Marked T 32 S R 3 W S 12 B T.
- A pine, 18 ins. diam., bears N.83\*W., 17 lks. dist.  
Marked T 32 S R 3 W S 1 B T.
- Land, mountainous.
- Soil, gravelly, third rate.
- Timber, fir, pine, hemlock and matherone.
- Undergrowth, laurel.
- Mountainous land, 80.00 chs.
- At this sec. cor., I set off 6\*57'N. on the decl. arc., and at 11\*59'a.m., l.m.t. to observe the sun on the meridian, the resulting latitude is 42\*49'N., which agrees with the proper latitude.
- 
- North, between secs. 1 and 6.
- Descend steep N. slope into Beaver Creek, through scattering timber and undergrowth.
- 8.00 Foot of mountain, 350 ft. below top of ridge, bears N.60\*E., and S.60\*W.
- 8.10 Beaver Creek, 5 lks. wide, pure water, stony bottom, course S.60\*W.
- Ascend S. slope of mountain.
