

## West Bdy. of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

## CHAINS

- 10.05 Beaver Creek Trail, bears NE. and SW.
- 40.00 Set an ironstone, 24x12x10 ins., 18 ins. in ground,  
for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on the W. face, from which  
A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.2\*E., 300 lks. dis.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 6 B T.  
A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.13\*W., 91 lks. dist.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 1 B T.
- 43.25 Top of ridge point, 500 ft. above creek, descends toward  
the SE. Descend over ridges and ravines into Beaver  
Creek.
- 78.51 Spring branch, 3 lks. wide, in ravine, 100 ft. deep, course  
S.60\*E.
- 83.85 Foot of descent, 300 ft. below top of ridge. Beaver  
Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S.30\*E. Ascend, South  
slope of mountain.
- 90.35 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, in ravine, 10 ft. deep,  
course SW.
- 98.60 Intersect S. Bdy. of T 31 S R 2 W, 150 chs. E. of the  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. on the S. bdy. of sec. 31, described heretofore  
at point of intersection.  
Set an ironstone, 36x12x12 ins., 27 ins. in ground, for  
closing corner of Tps. 32 S., Rs 2 and 3 W., marked  
C. C. on S. face, with 5 grooves on E. and 1 groove  
on W. faces, from which  
A matherone, 12 ins. diam., bears S.26\*E., 53 lks.  
Marked T 32 S R 2 W S 6 B T.  
A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.19\*W., 51 lks. dist.  
Marked T 32 S R 3 W S 1 B T.
- Land, mountainous.  
Soil, sandy and gravelly, second and third rates.  
Timber, fir, pine, hemlock, matherone, and cedar.  
Undergrowth, laurel, vine maple and small firs.  
Mountainous land, 98.60 chs.
