

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

## Subdivisions of T.32 S., R. 2 W.

## CHAINS

- N.89°54'E. on a random line between secs. 24 and 25.
- 40.00 Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
- 80.00 Intersect E. Bdy. of Tp., 19 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, which is a basalt stone, 6x8x6 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.
- Thence, I run N.89°58'W. on a true line between secs. 24 and 25. Ascend gradually along gentle S. slope, through heavily timbered and scattered undergrowth.
- 3.12 A fir, 36 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
- 32.13 Cold Creek, 5 lks. wide, in ravine, 15 ft. deep, course S.10°W.
- 40.00 Set a basalt stone, 18x12x10 ins., 12 ins. in ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on the N. face, from which
- A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.55°E., 38 lks. dist.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  s 24 B T.
- A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.44°W., 57 lks. dist.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 25 B T.
- 45.50 Ravine, 50 ft. deep, course South.
- 50.00 Enter swamp, bears N. and S.
- 52.75 Leave swamp, bears NW. and SE.
- 76.50 A cabin on line.
- 79.80 A fir, 60 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
- 80.00 The cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26.
- Land, rolling.
- Soil, sandy, second rate.
- Timber, sugar pine, yellow pine, and fir.
- Undergrowth, laurel, huckle berry and vine maple.
- Heavily timbered land.
