

Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 38 ins. diam., bears N.33½°E., 43 lks. dist.

Marked ¼ S 35 B T.

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S.68°W., 48 lks. dist.

Marked ¼ S 34 B T.

57.00 Dry bed of stream, 10 lks. wide, in canyon, 375 ft. deep, course S.50°E., Water sinks just above line. Ascend steep S. slope of mountain.

72.75 Enter old deadening, bears E. and W., some live timber standing.

80.00 Set an ironstone, 24x12x8 ins., 18 ins. in ground for cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, marked with 1 notch on S. and 2 notches on E. edges. No trees suitable for marking in limits.

Raise mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor. Pits impracticable.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, stony, fourth rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, and sugar pine.

Undergrowth, laurel, huckle berry and vine maple.

Mountainous land.

East, on a random line between secs. 26 and 35.

40.00 Set temp. ¼ sec. cor.

79.90 Intersect N. and S. line, 9 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36.

Thence, I run N.89°56'W. on a true line, between secs. 26 and 35.

Ascend along N. slope of ridge, through heavy timber and scattering undergrowth.

23.40 Ravine, 50 ft. deep, course N.60°E.

37.40 A sugar pine, 50 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.

38.00 Ridge point, 200 ft. above sec. cor., bears NW. and SE. Descend SW. slope into deep canyon.
