

Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

- Thence, I run S.89°54'W., on true line bet. secs. 2 & 11.
Descend through old burn, scattering timber and dense undergrowth.
- 12.75 Creek, 3 lks. wide, in ravine, 200 ft. deep, course N.10°E. Leave old burn and enter heavy timber, bears N.10°E. and S.10°W.
Ascend over ridge.
- 40.07 Set ironstone, 18x10x8 ins., 12 ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face, from which
A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.12°E., 45 lks. dist.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 11 B T.
A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.23°W., 54 lks. dist.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 2 B T.
- 54.25 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, in ravine, 100 ft. deep, course N.70°E. Ascend through scattering timber, bears N. and S.
- 68.21 Sugar pine, 60 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
- 80.14 The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.
Land, rolling and mountainous.
Soil, sandy and gravelly, second, third and fourth rate.
Timber, fir and yellow pine with a few sugar pines.
Undergrowth, laurel, vine maple and salmon berry.
Mountainous and heavily timbered lands.

- N.0°02'W., between secs. 2 and 3.
Ascend gradually through scattering timber and undergrowth.
- 2.00 Ridge point, 150 ft. above sec. cor., bears E. and W.
Descend.
- 5.50 Enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.
- 7.50 Ravine, 100 ft. deep, course N.40°E.
