

Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS	
20.50	Ridge point, 200 ft. above sec. cor., bears N.60*W., S.60*E. Descend along S. slope of ridge.
25.00	Over bed rock.
34.00	Leave bed rock, bears N. and SE. and ascend gradually.
39.84	A fir, 10 ins. diam., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 22 on N. face, and S 27 on S. face, from which A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.30*E., 6 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.60*E., 5 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
40.35	Summit of divide by Rogue and Umpqua rivers, 500 ft. above Trail Creek, bears N.60*E. and S.80*W. Descend along N. slope.
45.00	Enter heavy timber and very scattering undergrowth, bears N. and S.
49.10	Trail, bears N.30*E., S.30*W.
79.68	The cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27, and 28. Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy and rock, second and fourth rate. Timber, fir, hemlock and sugar pine. Undergrowth, laurel, vine maple, huckle berry and sallow. Mountainous and heavily timbered lands.
	Thence, I run N.0*02*W., between secs. 21 and 22. Descend along NW. slope, through heavy timber and scattering undergrowth.
0.50	Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, in ravine, 50 ft. deep, course West.
4.53	A fir, 30 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on the N. and S. sides.
10.00	Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, in ravine, 50 ft. deep, course S.70*W.
