

Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

N.89°59'E. on a random line between secs. 10 and 15.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

79.84 Intersect N. and S. line, 9 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15.

Thence, I run N.89°57'W. on a true line between secs. 10 and 15.

Over rolling land through heavy timber and scattering undergrowth.

9.65 A ravine, 50 ft. deep, course NE.

15.00 Enter scattering timber, bears N. and S.

39.97 Set a basalt stone, 28x12x4 ins., 21 ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.10°W., 189 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 15 B T.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.12 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 250 lks. dist.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 10 B T.

45.50 Enter heavy timber, bears N. and S.

61.50 Summit of divide, between Drews and Elk Creeks, 300 ft. above Drews Creek, bears N. and S. Descend into Drews Basin.

64.50 Brink of perpendicular bluffs, 75 ft. high, bears N. and S.

71.25 More gradual descent.

77.56 A fir, 28 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.

79.84 The cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16.

Land, rolling and mountainous.

Soil, sandy, third rate.

Timber, fir and sugar pine with some tamarack.

Undergrowth, laurel, mountainous and heavily timbered lands.

N.0°03'W., between secs. 9 and 10.

Descend gradually over small ridges and ravines on W.

slope, through heavy timber and scattering undergrowth.
