

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

## CHAINS

- 48.81 A fir, 30 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
- 56.00 A ridge, point, 200 ft. above creek, descends toward the South. Descend.
- 74.75 Spring branch, 3 lks. wide, in ravine, 50 ft. deep, course South. Ascend along S. slope of divide.
- 80.08 The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33.  
Land, rolling and mountainous.  
Soil, gravelly, third rate.  
Timber, fir, hemlock and sugar pine.  
Undergrowth, laurel, and huckleberry.  
Mountainous and heavily timbered lands.

- N.0\*04'W., between secs. 28 and 29.  
Ascend S. slope of mountain through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.
- 5.84 A fir, 30 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.
- 12.50 Summit of divide, between Rogue and Umpqua rivers, 600 ft. above Evans Creek, bears N. and S.40\*W.  
Thence, along divide.
- 12.55 Dim trail, bears N.10\*E. and SW.
- 24.00 Leave Rogue-Umpqua Divide, bears NE. and S. and descend along steep NW. slope.
- 40.00 Set a granite stone, 24x12x5 ins., 18 ins. in ground for  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  on W. face, from which  
A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears E.21 lks. dist.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S 28 B T.  
A fir, 16 ins; diam., bears N.5\*W., 30 lks. dist.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S 29 B T.
- 56.25 Enter deadening, bears E. and W.
- 65.00 Leave deadening and enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.
