

## Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

- A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.32°E., 41 lks. dist.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 28 B T.
- A hemlock 42 ins. diam., bears N. 8 lks. dist.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 21 B T.
- 52.00 Enter deadening, bears N. and S.
- 58.50 Leave deadening and enter heavy timber, bears N. and S.
- 61.589 A fir, 60 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on  
E. and W. sides.
- 75.00 Summit of ridge, 300 ft. above Peavine Creek, descends toward  
the NW. Descend.
- 80.20 The cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29.  
Land, mountainous.  
Soil, sandy, second rate.  
Timber, fir, hemlock and sugar pine.  
No undergrowth.  
Mountainous and heavily timbered lands.
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- N.0°04'W., between secs. 20 and 21.  
Descend NW. slope, through heavy timber and scattering  
undergrowth.
- 20.40 Fork of Cow Creek, 5 lks. wide, in canyon, 300 ft. deep,  
course N.60°W. Ascend over ridge point.
- 32.00 More gradual ascent.
- 40.00 Set a granite stone, 24x10x8 ins., 18 ins. in ground,  
for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on the W. face, from which  
A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.89 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 26 lks. dist.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 21 B T.  
A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.23°W., 41 lks. dist.  
Marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 20 B T.
- 41.00 Summit of ridge, 300 ft. above Cow Creek, bears N.80°W.,  
S.80°E. Descend gradually.
- 43.00 Enter scattering timber and dense undergrowth, bears E.  
and W.
