Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

- 41.75 Enter dense fir thicket, bears N. and S. and leave heavy timber.
- 55.00 Leave fir thicket and enter scattering timber, bears N. and S.
- 61.75 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course N.19*W.
- 71.65 Spring branch, 3 lks. wide, in ravine, 50 ft. deep, course North.
- 74.93 A fir, 60 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
- 80.34 The cor. of secs. 16, 17, 20 and 21.
Land, mountainous.
Soil, gravelly, third rate.
Timber, fir and hemlock.
Undergrowth, small firs, laurel and huckle berry.
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- N.0*04*W., between secs. 16 and 17.
Descend N. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.
- 11.75 Foot of mountain, 450 ft. below summit of Rogue-Umpqua divide, bears N.60*E., S.60*W.
- 11.80 Cow Creek, 25 lks. wide, swift current, stony bottom, course S.60*W.
Ascend S. slope of mountain.
- 28.75 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, in ravine, 100 ft. deep, course S.40*W.
- 40.00 Set a quartz stone, 24x12x8 ins., 18 ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the W. face, from which
A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears N.61 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 20 lks.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 16 B T.
A sugar pine, 60 ins. diam., bears S.25*W., 115 lks.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 17 B T.
