- 33.80 Over swampy land, bears N. and S.
- 35.00 Leave swamp, bears N. and S.
- 40.00 Set an ironstone, 18x12x8 ins., 12 ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the N. face, from which
 A hemlock, 30 ins. diam., bears N.83*E., 36 lks.
 Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 9 B T.
 A hemlock, 30 ins. diam., bears S.87*W., 40 lks.
 Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 16 B T.
 Enter scattering timber N. and S.
- 60.10 Spring branch, 3 lks. wide, in ravine, 20 ft. deep, course N.15*E.
- 80.10 The cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17.
 Land, rolling, swampy and mountainous.
 Soil, alluvial, and sandy, first and second rate.
 Timber, hemlock, fir, cedar, alder, maple and sugar pine.
 Undergrowth, laurel, small firs, fern and salmon berry.
 Mountainous and densely overgrown lands.

 Descend gradually NE. slope of mountain, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.
- 40.00 A fir, 10 ins. diam., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 8 on W. and S 9 on the E. faces, from which
 A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.67*E., 15 lks. dist.
 Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 9 B T.
 A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.88*W., 16 lks. dist.
 Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 8 B T.
- 40.40 Ravine, 25 ft. deep, course N.80*E.
- 43.80 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, in ravine, 10 ft. deep, course N.70*E.
- 54.50 Enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.
- 65.43 A fir, 20 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.
- 67.00 Enter scattering timber, bears E. and W.
