

Subdivisions T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS	
62.55	Drews Creek, 15 lks. wide, swift current, stony bottom, course N.60*W. Ascend along N. slope of mountain,
80.10	The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9. Land, mountainous. Soil, stony, third and fourth rate. Timber, fir and hemlock. Undergrowth, laurel, small firs and huckle berry. Mountainous and densely overgrown.
Thence, I run N.0*04'W. between secs. 4 and 5. Descend steep N. slope, into Drews Creek, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.	
23.00	Foot of mountain, 500 ft. below summit of Cow- Umpqua Divide, bears NW. and SE.
23.05	Drews Creek, 20 lks. wide, stony bottom, swift current, course NW. Ascend S. slope of mountain.
35.00	Top of ridge, 300 ft. above creek, descends toward the SW. Descend into canyon.
40.00	Set an ironstone, 24x15x5 ins., 18 ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the W. face, from which A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.41*E., 31 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 4 B T. A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.47*W., 34 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 5 B T.
45460	Foot of canyon, 200 ft. below ridge point, bears N.80*W., S.80*E. Creek, 10 lks. wide, course N.80*W. Ascend steep S. slope of mountain.
74.25	Enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.
78.00	Summit of divide, between forks of Drews Creek, bears NW. and SE., 500 ft. above Drews Creek. Descend steep NE. slope.
