Subdivisions T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

Thence up creek.

73.20 Leave Cow Creek, course West, and ascend along N. slope of mountain.

74.70 Spring branch, 3 lks. wide, in ravine, 10 ft. deep, course N.

80.00 The cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32.

Land, level and mountainous.

Soil, sandy loam and gravelly, first and third rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder and sugar pine.

Undergrowth, laurel, elk thorns and small firs.

Mountainous land.

N.0°04'W., between secs. 29 and 30.

Descend the N. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

5.15 Foot of mountain, 100 ft. below sec. cor., bears NE. and SW. Cow Creek, 25 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, swift current, sandy bottom, course SW. Ascend gradually.

5.69 A fir, 60 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.

9.00 Leave heavy timber and enter old burn, bears E. and W. Some live timber standing.

32.00 Leave burn and enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.

40.00 A hemlock 8 ins. diam., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 30 on W. and S 29 on the E. faces, from which

A hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears N.54°E., 44 lks. dis.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A sugar pine, 50 ins. diam., bears S.52°W., 45 lks.

Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

57.00 Creek, 3 lks. wide, in ravine, 50 ft. deep, course S.70°E.

57.50 Enter scattering timber, bears NW. and SE.

66.00 Enter heavy timber, bears E. and W.
