

Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

- 58.00 Ridge, 400 ft. above sec. cor., bears N. and S. Descend gradually E. slope of mountain.
- 66.57 A fir, 30 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
- 79.80 The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30.
Land, mountainous.
Soil, sandy, second rate.
Timber, fir, hemlock, sugar pine and tamarack.
Undergrowth, laurel.
Mountainous and heavily timbered lands.
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- N.0*05*W., between secs. 19 and 20.
Ascend S. slope of mountain, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- 17.50 Leave heavy timber and enter old burn, bears E. and W. some live timber standing.
- 36.00 Summit of Divide between forks of Cow Creek, 500 ft. above S. fork Cow Creek, bears NE. and S. Descend gradually.
- 40.00 A chinquapin, 10 ins. diam., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 19 on W. and S 20 on E. faces, from which
A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N.34*E., 236 lks.
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
No other tree in limits. Raise mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor. Pits impracticable.
- 43.75 Enter scattering timber, bears NW. and SE.
- 80.00 Set an ironstone, 18x10x6 ins., 12 ins. in ground, for cor. of secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20, marked with 3 notches on S. and 5 notches on E. edges, from which
A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.24 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 11 lks.
Marked T 32 S R 2 W S 17 B T.
A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears S.69*E., 52 lks. dist.
Marked T 32 S R 2 W S 20 B T.
