General Description, Continued.

CHAINS

is found in the SE., cedar in the N. and maple and matherone in the W. The greater part of the township is overgrown with laurel, huckleberry vine, maple and sallal.

The rawley Copper Mines are situated in sec. 4. There are several mining prospects in secs. 5 and 6. There are no indications of valuable mineral in other parts of the township.

This region is well watered by the large tributaries of the Rogue and Umpqua Rivers. Drews Creek drains the North, Elk Creek, the East, Trail and Evans Creek the south, and Cow Creek the West. The township is a net-work of rills, spring branches and creeks. There is a small shallow lake situated in section 16 at the head of Drews Creek.

Nearly all of the eastern part of the township has been squatted on. Settlers cabins are found in secs. 1, 12, 13, 14, 15, ²⁴23 and 25 and 28. There are settlers in other parts of the township.

Resurvey of Portions of East Bdy., T 32 S., R. 3 W.

The falling of the line bet. secs. 13 and 24 being out of limits with the reported length of the E. bdy. of sec. 13, I commence at the cor. of secs. 18 and 19, on the W. bdy. of T. 32 S R 2 W, which is an ironstone, 12x8x5 ins., above ground, firmly set and marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.

Thence, I run

North on W. bdy. of sec. 18

Over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

7.50 The cor. of secs. 13 and 24.

Thence, North between secs. 13 and 18. Descend NE. slope.
