

Resurvey of E. Bdy. of T 32 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

- 9.75 The cor. of secs. 1 and 12.
Thence North, between secs. 1 and 6.
Leave heavy timber, bears NE. and SW.
- 39.50 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., between secs. 1 and 6 bears E. 20 lks. dist., which is an ironstone, 12x10x6 ins., above ground, firmly set and marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.
The course of this line is N.0°17'E., and the length is 39.50 chs.
Commencing at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., I run North between secs. 1 and 6. Continue measurement.
- 7.50 Summit of ridge bears NW. and SE. Thence along E. slope.
- 10.00 Enter heavy timber, bears NW. and SE.
- 14.85 Spring.
- 30.35 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course E.
- 39.00 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course E.
- 44.50 West Fork of Beaver Creek, 4 lks. wide, course SE.
Ascend S. slope.
- 48.50 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SW.
- 49.35 Leave heavy timber, bears NW. and SE.
- 58.00 The cor. of Tps. 32 S, Rs 2 and 3 W, which is an ironstone, 10x10x9 ins. above ground, firmly set and marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, bears East, 30 lks. dist.
The course of this line is N.0°19'E., and the length is 58.00 chs.
Land, mountainous.
Soil, loam and stony, second and third rate.
Timber, red and white fir, sugar pine, cedar, hemlock, and laurel.
Undergrowth, manzanita, laurel, chinquapin, buck brush.
Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 97.50 chs.
