	<p>Thence I run S.89°58'W., on N bdy of sec. 1</p> <p>Over mountainous land through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.</p> <p>Along S slope.</p>
1.50	<p>The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on S bdy of sec. 31, which is an ironstone 10x6x5ins above ground, firmly set and marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p>
7.35	<p>West Fork of Beaver Creek, 3 lks. wide, course SE.</p> <p>Asc E slope.</p> <p>Enter heavy timber, bears NW and SE.</p>
15.50	<p>Intersect E bdy of T 31 S, R 3 W, 6.82 chs North of the cor of Tps 31 S, Rs 2 and 3W, which is a fir post 5 ins sq., 20 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p> <p>Set a fir post 3 ft. long, 5 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of Tp 31 S, R 2 W, and Tp 32 S, R 3 W, on E bdy of Tp 31 S, R 3 W, marked</p> <p>T 31 S R 2 W S 31 on NE and T 32 S R 3 W S 1 on SE face, with 6 notches on N & E edges; from which</p> <p>A red fir, 24 ins. diam. bears N.42°E., 36 lks. dist. marked T 31 S R 2 W S 31 BT.</p> <p>A red fir, 18 ins. diam. bears S.43°E., 42 lks., dist. marked T 32 S R 3 W S 1 BT.</p> <p>Land, mountainous.</p> <p>Soil, loam and stony, 2nd and 3d rate.</p> <p>Timber, red and white fir, sugar pine, cedar, hemlock, undergrowth, hemlock, chinkapin, hazel, laurel.</p> <p>Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 15.50 chs.</p>
	<p>The line bet secs 1 and 12 being out of limits with the reported length of the N bdy of sec 1, I commence at the cor of secs 1, 2, 35, and 36, on the N bdy of Tp 32 S, R 3 W, which is a granite stone 10x7x5 ins above ground, firmly set and marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p> <p>Thence I run</p> <p>East bet secs. 1 and 36.</p> <p>Over mountainous land through dense undergrowth.</p> <p>Asc SW slope.</p>
3.00	<p>Summit of ridge bears N and S.</p> <p>Desc. SE slope.</p>
13.00	<p>Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S.</p> <p>Asc. SW slope.</p>
41.98	<p>Intersect $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., which is a slate stone 6x4x4 ins above ground, firmly set and marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.</p> <p>The course of this line is East and the length is 41.98 chs.</p> <p>Commencing at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. I run</p> <p>East bet secs. 1 and 36.</p>
3.00	<p>Enter heavy timber, bears NW and SE</p>
4.00	<p>Summit of ridge bears N and S.</p> <p>Desc. E. slope.</p>
