80.00	Set post, cor. to Secs. 7, 12, 18 and 13, from which A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.32*E., 76 lks. dist. A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears S.70*E., 21 lks. dist. A Laurel, 29 ins. diam., bears S.50*W., 20 lks. dist. A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.28*W., 31 lks. dist. Land, mountainous, 3rd rate. Timber, same species as other line North. 2nd rate. I run the two foregoing miles October 3, 1871, but detecting an error in the chaining, I remeasured it October 4, 1871, moving the posts to where they now stand, from their first position, some 50 lks. North, to one chain in the same direction.	
<p>The Northern portion of this Tp. contains a portion of first rate land along Cow Creek and its tributaries. It is well timbered with the various kinds of Fir, Pine, Cedar, Laurel, Yew, Alder and Maple. Being rich in timber, agricultural lands and water power, I have subdivided it.</p>
