	Vine-Maple, Salal Berry, Ocean Spray and Huckleberry. Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 80 chs.
	Thence, I run South on true line, between Secs. 19 and 24.
1.55	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S.60*E. Ascend spur.
3.00	Spur, sloping SE., 25 ft. above creek; descend.
6.50	Creek, 6 lks. wide, course East 25 ft. below last spur; ascend spur.
20.00	Top of spur, sloping East 300 ft. above creek; descend.
30.75	Ravine, bears NW. and SE. 75 ft. below last spur; ascend spur.
33.00	Spur, sloping East, 50 ft. above ravine; descend.
40.00	Set a basalt stone, 14 x 8 x 8 ins., 9 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W face, from which A Cedar, 14 ins. diam., bears N.80*E., 36 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A Cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears S.55*W., 37 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. This cor. is on a hillside, sloping SE. 25 ft. below top of spur.
42.50	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course East, 20 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor.
44.25	Creek, 7 lks. wide, course NE.; begin ascent.
68.25	Top of spur, sloping East, 400 ft. above creeks. Thence, along rocky hillside, sloping East.
80.00	Set a basalt stone, 14 x 8 x 8 ins., 9 ins. in the ground for cor. of Secs. 19, 30, 25 and 24, marked with 4 notches on North and 2 notches on South edges, from which
