CHAINS

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.58*E., 87 lks. dist.
marked T 32 S R 3 W S 19 B T.

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.80*E., 61 lks. dist.,
marked T 32 S R 3 W S 30 B T.

A Cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears S.62*W., 34 lks. dist.,
marked T 32 S R 4 W S 25 B T.

A Pine, 48 ins. diam., bears N.62*W., 70 lks. dist.,
marked T 32 S R 4 W S 24 B T.

This cor. is on a hillside, sloping East.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, third and fourth rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Pine, Hemlock, Chinquapin, Maple,
Alder, Madrona, Dogwood and Yew.

Dense undergrowth of rhodendron, Vine-Maple, Hazel,
Huckleberry and Salal Berry.

Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense
undergrowth, 80.00 chs.

Thence, I run

South, on a true line, between Secs. 25 and 30.

Descend into ravine.

3.75 Bottom of ravine, 25 ft. below cor.

From this point a large spring bears East 150 lks. dist.

Ascend spur.

8.00 Top of spur, sloping East 60 ft. above ravine.

Descend into canyon.

18.25 Bottom of canyon, 50 ft below last spur; ascend spur.

20.00 Top of spur, sloping East, 25 ft. above canyon.

Descend.

25.50 Creek, 6 lks. wide, course East 25 ft. below last spur;
ascend spur.
