

Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

68.00 Trail on summit of ridge, bears North and South.

81.50 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course SE.

97.00 Intersect East bdy. of the Tp. 9.75 chs. North of the corner of Secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, which is an ironstone 10x5x5 ins. above ground, firmly set and marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

Set a granite stone, 18x14x4 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for closing corner of Secs. 1 and 12, marked CC on W, with 1 groove on N. and 5 grooves on S. face, from which

A Pine, 9 ins. diam., bears N.80*W., 84 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 1 B T.

A Red Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.23*W., 86 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 12 B T.

I destroy marks on former corner bearing trees referring to these sections.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loam and stony, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber, Red Fir, Yellow and Sugar Pine, Cedar and Laurel.

Undergrowth, Manzanita, Vine Maple, Arrowwood and Laurel.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth. 97.00 chs.

From the corner of Secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14, I run East, on a true line, between Secs. 12 and 13.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Along North slope.
