

Subdivisions of T. 32 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous.  
 Soil, loam and stony; second and third rate.  
 Timber, Red and White Fir, Sugar Pine, Cedar, Hemlock  
 and Laurel.  
 Undergrowth, Pine, Laurel, Fir and Arrowwood.  
 Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered  
 with dense undergrowth, 80.00 chs.

East, on a true line, between Secs. 13 and 24.  
 Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense  
 undergrowth.

Ascend NW. slope.

19.00 Summit of divide, between Applegate and Cow Creeks, in  
 gap, between Red Mountain and Balm Butte, bears North  
 and South.

Descend along SE. slope.

40.00 Set a serpentine stone 15x8x6 ins., 10 ins. in the  
 ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on North face, from  
 which

A Red Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.7\*W., 48 lks. dist.,  
 marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. 13 B T.

A Red Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.67\*W., 26 lks. dist.,  
 marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 24 B T.

Descend East slope to Cow creek.

74.50 Cow creek, 15 lks. wide, course NE.

Ascend West slope.

97.85 Intersect East Bdy. of the Tp. 7.50 chs. North of the  
 cor. of Secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, which is an ironstone  
 12x8x6 ins. above ground, firmly set and marked and  
 witnessed as described by the surveyor general.

Set a granite stone 16x10x8 ins., 11 ins. in the ground  
 for closing cor. of Secs. 13 and 24, marked CC on W,
