

Retracement-Reestablishment of Subdivisions Lines of T. 32 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.50\*E., 14 lks. dist.,  
marked T 32 S R 3 W S 15 B T.

A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.64\*W., 20 lks. dist.,  
marked T 32 S R 3 W S 16 B T.

I destroy the marks on former bearing tree, referring to  
Sec. 21. The true course and distance of this line,  
from the  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor. is S.89\*48'W., 39.32 chs.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, decomposed granite; third rate.

Timber, Fir and Sugar Pine.

Undergrowth, Lilac, Snow Brush, Rhododendron, Arrowwood  
and Willow.

September 15, 1913.

At the cor. of Secs. 15 and 16.  
Thence I retrace,

North, between Secs. 15 and 16, and at 38.86 chs. fall  
32 lks. West of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor.

Commencing again at the  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor., I continue the re-  
tracement North, and at 37.29 chs. fall 56 lks. East  
of the cor. of Secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16.

The cor. of Secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, is located by refer-  
ence to the NE., SW., and stump of the NW. bearing  
trees. All other traces of the cor. have disappeared.

I reestablish the cor. in its original position as fol-  
lows:

Set a granite stone, 15 x 15 x 12 ins., 10 ins. in the  
ground, for cor. Secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, marked with  
4 notches on S. and 3 notches on East edge; from  
which

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.2\*E., 40 lks. dist.,  
marked T 32 S R 3 W S 10 B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.1\*E., 57 lks. dist.,  
marked T 32 S R 3 W S 15 B T.
