

Extension Survey of Subdivision of T. 32 S. R. 3 W

CHAINS

40.00 Set basalt stone, 12 x 10 x 5 ins., 8 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on North face, from which

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.14*W., 10 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 27 B T.

A Hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears S.20*E., 6 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 34 B T.

50.00 Leave heavy timber, bears North and South.

Enter scattering timber and dense undergrowth, in old burn.

58.00 Ridge, bears North and South. Descend along spur, slopes West.

80.00 Set a granite stone, 15 x 6 x 6 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for cor. to Secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34, marked with 1 notch on South and 3 notches on East edge, from which

- A Fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N.83*E., 52 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 27 B T.
- A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.82*E., 47 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 34 B T.
- A Cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears S.7*W., 102 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 33 B T.
- A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.82*W., 16 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 28 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, to 60 chs. stony clay loam; third rate; to 80.00 chs. decomposed granite; third rate.

Timber, Fir and Hemlock.

Undergrowth, Lilac, Snow Brush, Madrona and Rhododendron.

October 3, 1913.

At the cor. of Secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34.
Thence I run

West, on a Sectional Correction line, between Secs. 28 and 33.
