

Extension Survey of the Subdivision of T.32 S., R. 3 W.

CHAINS

S.0*26'W. of the cor. of Secs. 25 and 36, previously described.

At point of intersection, I set a serpentine stone, 15 x 8 x 6 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of Secs. 30 and 31, marked C C on E., with 5 grooves on North and 1 groove on South face; from which

A Pinon, 5 ins. diam., bears N.63*E., 51 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 30 B T.

A Pinon, 4 ins. diam., bears S.66*E., 112 lks. dist., marked T 32 S R 3 W S 31 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, red clay loam, and serpentine rock; fourth rate.

Timber, Fir, Sugar and Yellow Pine and Cedar.

Undergrowth, Manzanita, live Oak, Chinquapin, Madrona and Arrowwood.

October 15, 1913.

Sept. 24; From the cor. of Secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, I run S.0*01'E., on a random line, between Secs. 35 and 36.

40.00 Set temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor.

80.02 Intersect the Stand. Par South, 2 lks. East of the Stand. cor. of Secs. 35 and 36.

Thence, I run

North, on a true line, between Secs. 35 and 36.

Ascend along East slope, through dense timber and undergrowth.

19.20 Spur, slopes NE.

28.35 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NE.

40.02 Set a serpentine stone, 14 x 12 x 6 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on West face, from which
